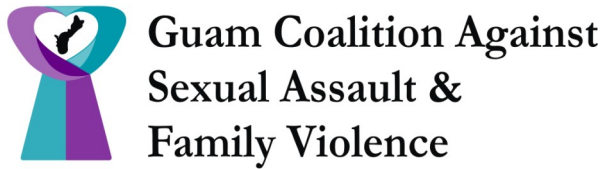

Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault & Family Violence

The Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault & Family Violence (GCASAFV) is a non-profit organization whose members are other community-based providers, government allies, and individuals who address sexual assault and family violence issues on Guam.

GCASAFV PURPOSES:

- To address sexual assault and family violence issues with one united voice.
- To provide education, outreach and training regarding sexual assault and family violence.
- To identify gaps in services to victims of sexual assault and family violence and to make recommendations for changes.
- To speak out so that victims of sexual assault and family violence on Guam can readily get the services that they need.
- To build the capacity of organizations and networks through training and education in order to meet Guam's sexual assault and family violence needs.
- To be sure that voices of survivors of sexual assault and family violence guide the work of the GCASAFV.



WHAT IS SEXUAL ASSAULT?*

Sexual Assault is a crime motivated by a need to control, humiliate and harm. Perpetrators use sexual assault as a weapon to hurt and dominate others. Sexual assault is forced or coerced sexual contact without consent. Consent is the presence of a clear "yes", not the absence of a "no". It can take the form of:

- Rape
- Incest
- Child Sexual Abuse/ Molestation
- Oral Sex
- Harassment
- Exposing/flashing
- Forcing a person to pose for sexual pictures
- Fondling or unwanted sexual touching above or under clothing
- Force which may include but is not limited to:
 - Use or display of a weapon
 - Physical battering
 - Immobilization of the victim



WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?*

Domestic Violence is a pattern of behavior used to establish power and control over another person through fear and intimidation, often including the threat or use of violence. Some signs of an abusive relationship include:

- Exerting strict control (financial, social and/or appearance)
- Needing constant contact including excessive texts and calls
- Insulting a partner in front of other people
- Extreme jealousy
- Showing fear around a partner
- Isolation from family and friends
- Frequent canceling of plans at the last minute
- Unexplained injuries or explanations that don't quite add up



NO MORE is a groundbreaking symbol designed to galvanize change and radically increase the awareness of domestic violence and sexual assault in our communities.

KNOW MORE. Learn the signs of domestic violence and listen without judgment to victims/survivors of sexual assault. Get the facts and know the resources available.

SAY NO MORE. Break the Silence Speak out. Seek help when you see this problem or harassment of any kind in your family, your community, your workplace or school.

SHARE NO MORE. Share the NO MORE symbol with everyone you know. Facebook it. Tweet it. Pin it. Instagram it. Email it. Wear it. Help to increase awareness about the extent of domestic violence and sexual assault. Visit the NO MORE Shop at nomore.org.
