**1:00 PM to 4:30 PM, Registration at 12:30 PM**

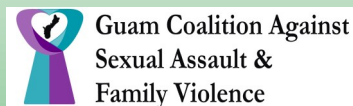
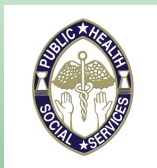
