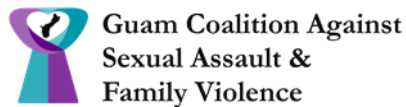


Join us for a free Training of Trainers!

Integrating Health Services into Domestic Violence Agencies and Community-based Organizations Across Guam

Description: Domestic violence and community-based advocates are in a unique position to discuss with their clients short- and long-term health needs related to domestic violence (DV) and human trafficking (HT) and promote a culture of wellness and healing. By building staff capacity and growing local partnerships with community health centers, advocates can increase their clients' access to health care by offering: health insurance enrollment and facilitated clinic appointments for primary care, reproductive health and substance use coercion; offering over-the-counter medication; and promoting yoga, sleep and self-care while in program/shelter.

This Training of Trainers begins with a 3.5 hour training by FUTURES faculty of a trauma-informed approach to integrate health assessment into DV agencies and other community based organizations. The curriculum explores: support for staff/capacity building and self-care; health impact of DV/HT; about health centers and partnerships; and new approaches to incorporate health assessment. Following, the afternoon will focus on attendee readiness as trainers, providing time to ask questions, and discuss strategies. This interactive training includes small group exercises, group discussions and "pair and share" opportunities, as well as didactic material to appeal to different learner styles. The PowerPoint curriculum and training tools will be available to all participants so attendees can conduct their own similar trainings and help identify potential health center partners. An hour lunch will be reserved between the morning and afternoon sessions.
