Toby Shulruff is a Senior Technology Safety Specialist with the SafetyNet Project at the National Network to End Domestic Violence and has worked with advocates and survivors on the national, state, territory, tribal, and local levels to strengthen organizations, advance systems coordination improve survivor services and prevent violence since 1997. She supported local sexual assault programs and state coalitions in her work with the Washington Coalition of Sexual Assault Programs and the National Sexual Assault Coalition Resource Sharing Project. She worked to improve services for victims of all crimes as Policy Coordinator for the Washington State Office of Crime Victims Advocacy and as a consultant on the Wraparound Victim Legal Assistance Networks project with the National Crime Victim Law Institute.

Romuel B. Nafarrete has a BS in Economics, an MS in Education, and a PhD in Management.
