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Alicia L. Aiken, JD

Alicia Aiken, JD, specializes in delivering entertaining & interactive training about serious topics, and she coaches professionals to problem-solve around difficult situations. Alicia is a Principal at the [Danu Center for Strategic Advocacy](#), which supports the work of change-makers, helping professionals, and mission-based organizations to build the tools of social justice. She is also a Faculty Fellow for PLI's Interactive Learning Center, where she has co-created 4 award-winning on-line courses and hosts the podcast "[Pursuing Justice: The Pro Bono Files](#)". In 2018, Alicia received the American Bar Association's Sharon L. Corbitt Award for Exemplary Legal Service to Victims of Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault and Stalking, which was granted in part as recognition for the Protecting Privacy to Enhance Safety Subpoena Defense Pro Bono Project launched for the ABA in 2014.

Prior to Confidentiality Institute, Alicia spent 15 years with Legal Aid Chicago, Illinois' largest legal services program, where she represented victims of domestic violence and people living in poverty in a variety of complex legal matters. While at Legal Aid Chicago, Ms. Aiken rose to the position of Director of Training, Pro Bono and Client Support Services, and served on the Executive Committee of the 13 million dollar non-profit organization. University of Michigan granted Alicia Aiken undergraduate and law degrees in 1992 and 1995, and she has practiced trial and appellate law in Illinois, Vermont, and Michigan.
