GCASAFV will be conducting its 2023 kNOW MORE Training Series: Addressing Sexual Assault / Domestic Violence - Journey to Healing. This will take place on March 21st & 22nd from 8:00AM to 4:00PM and will be held at The Westin Resort Guam. Oftentimes, we overlook the healing aspect when it comes to abuse. This training will touch upon the dynamics to impart a greater understanding of how we can support survivors in their journey to healing.

GCASAFV will feature off-island trainers, as well as local presenters who are our partners in providing services for the community. Please note that this training will feature three different tracks focusing on Domestic Violence, Sexual Assault, and Journey to Healing. Attendees will have the option to attend different breakout sessions with presentations on varying topics on Day 2.

Featured off-island presenters include:



Jane Anderson

Jane brings her expertise in prosecuting domestic violence, stalking, sexual violence, and human trafficking to her role as an Attorney Advisor with AEquitas. Prior to joining AEquitas, Jane served as a prosecutor in Miami, Florida where she tried many of the state's first human trafficking cases.

In her role as a founding member of the Human Trafficking Unit, Jane developed policies to better identify and provide necessary services to trafficking victims, while ensuring offender accountability through the use of digital evidence and creative charging decisions. Jane also served as a supervisor in the Domestic Violence Unit, where she trained new attorneys and oversaw the prosecution of domestic violence, stalking, and violations of protection orders. Throughout her career, Jane prosecuted felony-level crimes of all types, including homicide, kidnapping, and sexual assault. Jane will be presenting on Safer Victims, Stronger Cases: Benefits of Trauma-Informed Prosecution and on Prosecuting Stalking Case & Trauma Informed Prosecution.



Nina Jusuf

Nina has been working on domestic violence and sexual assault issues since 1992, starting as a hotline volunteer before becoming a shelter-based domestic violence advocate and later as the Executive Director of the San Francisco Women Against Rape for five years. She is one of the founders of National Organization of Asians and Pacific Islanders Ending Sexual Violence (NAPIESV)

and has led numerous trainings and technical assistance on sexual assault and domestic violence issues and Asian Pacific Islander-specific trauma-informed services. Nina believes in collective wellness beyond self-care and has led/facilitated trainings on organizational sustainability; multicultural wellness, sustaining activists and activism; and genuine security for survivors, activists, and women human rights defenders in Asia, the Balkans, and United States. Nina will be presenting on Accessible Wellness Across the Lifespan and Sexual Assault Framework to Healing Through Cultural Lens.



Jennifer Landhuis (M.S.)

Jennifer is the Director of the Stalking Prevention, Awareness, and Resource Center (SPARC), an AEquitas initiative. As Director of SPARC, she oversees the multi-faceted programming on stalking, including the development of resources and publications as well as training and technical assistance. Jennifer has over 22 years of

experience as an educator and advocate on the issues of stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault. Prior to joining SPARC, she designed and facilitated state and national trainings on stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault to build the capacity of criminal justice systems; served as an advocate and educator for local domestic violence/sexual assault community-based crisis centers; and provided crisis intervention, including support, safety planning, information, shelter placement, and referrals for victims of stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault. Jennifer will be presenting on Know More, Do More: Recognizing and Responding to Stalking in Domestic Violence Cases and Risk Assessment & Safety Planning in Stalking Cases.



Nicole Matthews

Nicole is Anishinabe from the White Earth Band of Ojibwe and is the Executive Director for the Minnesota Indian Women’s Sexual Assault Coalition (MIWSAC), a statewide Tribal Coalition and a national Tribal Technical Assistance Provider. Nicole was one of five researchers who interviewed 105 Native women used in prostitution and trafficking

for their report: Garden of Truth: The Prostitution and Trafficking of Native Women in Minnesota. She is a TedX Speaker, and spoke at statewide, tribal, and national venues on sexual violence, sex trafficking, and the intersections of racism and oppression. Nicole will be presenting on Addressing Sexual Violence in Native Communities. Cultural Examination of Sexual Assault in Native Communities and Utilizing Native Values for Safety, Justice & Healing.



Victoria “Tori” Wynecoop-Abrahamsom (she/her)

Tori is a citizen of the Spokane Tribe located in Eastern Washington State and the Training and Technical Assistance Manager at the National Center on Domestic Violence, Trauma, and Mental Health (NCDVTMH). She began her advocacy journey during her undergraduate career at Illinois

College by establishing a sexual assault support group in response to the #MeToo movement. After graduation,

she returned home to the Spokane Indian Reservation and worked as a Domestic Violence Advocate providing assistance to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, teen dating violence, stalking, and elder abuse. Assistance for survivors often included accessing resources for civil and criminal court cases, mental health support, and substance use services. Tori will be presenting Self-care and Burnout for Advocates & Staff who work with Domestic Violence Survivors.



Mira Yusef

Mira is the Executive Director of Monsoon Asians & Pacific Islanders in Solidarity (Monsoon) and a co-founder and staff member of NAPIESV, a program under Monsoon that provides technical assistance and training nationally, in the U.S. territories, and at some international sites. She has helped incubate four other organizations

serving victims of gender-based violence in marginalized populations: Nisaa African Family Services; Iowa Affirmation and Resources Chat chatline; Iowa Coalition for Collective Change; and Support for Arab Families in Iowa. Since 2010, Mira has been organizing and facilitating trainings and technical assistance on addressing gender-based violence locally, nationally, and internationally. Mira will be presenting on National Trends/Emerging Issues on Sexual Assault and Asian Pacific Islanders. Together with Nina Jusuf they will be presenting on Sexual Advocacy in Asian Pacific Islander Communities and A Fundamental Review of Services for Sexual Assault Survivors.

FEBRUARY HIGHLIGHTS

Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS), Guam Office of Minority Health (GOMH) – Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services (CLAS) Training.



The Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services, Guam Office of Minority Health conducted its 8.0 hour CLAS Training Sessions. Staff from the Guam Coalition Against Sexual and Family Violence along with members of Guam Department of Education, University of Guam, Guam Community College, DPHSS and Guma Mami were in attendance.

GOMH works in cross-collaboration with government agencies, the private sectors and with stakeholders in the promotion and provision of CLAS trainings. The CLAS mandates are U.S federal requirements that support compliance with the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

This training uses local and regional applications of cultural and linguistic competence to increase the quality of services to diverse populations and to increase health equity outcomes.

The CLAS training helps improve skill sets to strengthen service delivery to minority populations, people experiencing health and wellness disparities and those who may be marginalized and under-represented. The CLAS Training helps to increase the opportunities to increase health equity for those served. Future trainings will be held monthly.

The next 8.0 Hour CLAS Training will be held on Monday, March 20, 2023, at the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC), 3rd Floor Training Room from 8am to 5pm. For more information, email Alex Silverio (Alex.Silverio@dphss.guam.gov).

Featured Partner: Guma' Mami, Inc.

Guma' Mami is a nonprofit community-based organization dedicated to providing support and services to individuals with disabilities on Guam. The organization was formed in the early 1980s by a group of family members of individuals with disabilities, professionals in the disability field, and concerned community members to address the critical community needs of supportive housing and case management services for individuals with disabilities. Since then, Guma' Mami has been advocating for development and expansion of services for individuals with disabilities.

Guma' Mami currently operates a dual service program which provides supportive services to persons or families with disabilities who are survivors of sexual assault and/or domestic violence. The program is staffed by a part-

time bilingual Survivor Advocate whose duties primarily focus on case management services, including facilitating a support group for women survivors with disabilities. The Survivor Advocate is supervised and guided by the Executive Director.

As one of the subgrantees of GCASAFV's Allstate Moving Ahead Grant, Guma' Mami plans to enhance the capacity of its Atbola Program, in providing support and services to survivors of domestic violence on their recovery journey to wellness and independence. In line with Allstate Foundation's goal to end domestic violence by disrupting the cycle of relationship abuse and creating a society where women are empowered, Guma' Mami proposes to adopt components of the Moving Ahead curriculum to educate on financial empowerment, support vital resources, and facilitate a national (and local) conversation in its implementation of the grant, with focus on economic empowerment for survivors with disabilities.

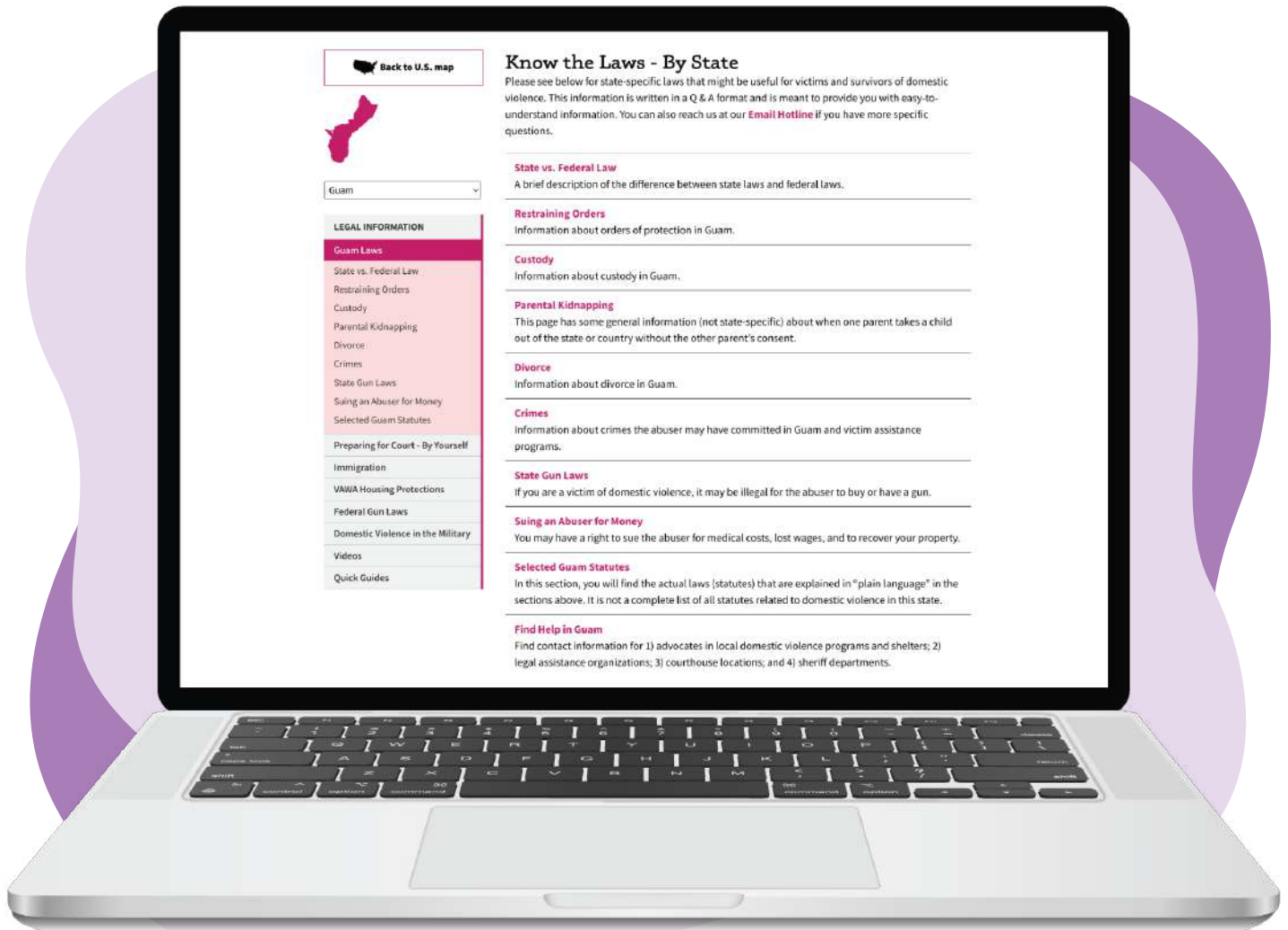

WomensLaw.org was founded in Brooklyn, NY in February 2000 by Elizabeth Martin, with the help of a group of lawyers, teachers, advocates, and web designers who were interested in seeing the power of the Internet help survivors of domestic violence. In 2001, the WomensLaw.org website was launched to provide state-specific legal information and resources for survivors of domestic violence. In 2002, WomensLaw.org added a confidential Email Hotline to offer direct support to survivors, their advocates, friends, and family members. Today, more than 3.9 million unique users visit the website annually, and WomensLaw.org provides referrals and information to more than 5,000 individuals through the Email Hotline.

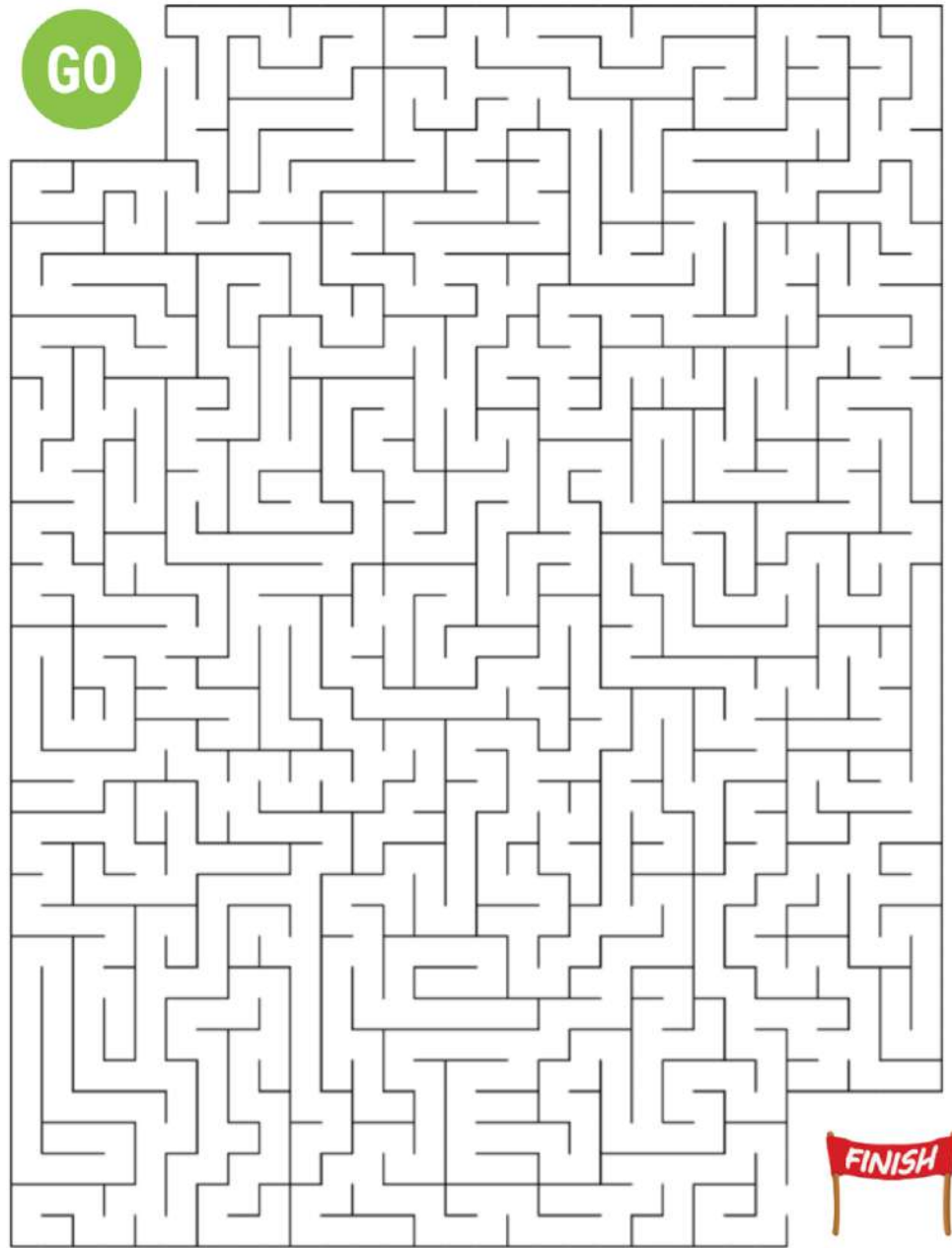
