Presenter Biographies

CRISTINA ARIAS has been working in the field of domestic violence for 18 years. She has provided direct services to hundreds of survivors and their families by creating safety plans and by navigating the complex system of institutions, community services, and resources (e.g., public benefits, housing, employment, restraining order, custody, immigration, and divorce). In her current role as the Vice President of the Survivor Advocacy Services, at the Domestic Violence Action Center in Honolulu, Hawaii, Ms. Arias provides leadership and supervision to direct service agency programs. She also works to oversee quality management program infrastructures and ensure effective services in the community, courts, and in cooperation with other agency initiatives. Her work also oversees the legal and advocacy administrative management, culturally based programs, and ensures responsive and effective delivery of client services.

NINA JUSUF has been working on domestic violence and sexual assault issues since 1992, starting as a hotline volunteer before becoming a shelter-based domestic violence advocate and later as the Executive Director of the San Francisco Women Against Rape for five years. She is one of the founders of NAPIESV and has led numerous trainings and technical assistance on sexual assault and domestic violence issues in general and API-specific trauma-informed services. Nina believes in collective wellness beyond self-care and has led/facilitated trainings on organizational sustainability, multicultural wellness, sustaining activists and activism and genuine security for survivors, activists and women human rights defenders in Asia, the Balkans, and United States. In addition, Nina has experience in leading an experiential learning-based youth organization and overseeing Home Based Childcare Center and Nutrition Program. She can be reached at nina@napiesv.org

NANCI KREIDMAN, M.A. is the Chief Executive Officer and Co-Founder of the Domestic Violence Action Center (DVAC). DVAC is the leading voice in the community keeping violence against women as a priority issue for discourse, public policy, community planning, resource allocation, system reform, and community awareness. She has been working with local and national efforts to address family violence issues for more than 35 years on a variety of topics related to families, women, and children. Nanci conducts training for many audiences, including the health care, faith based, legal, academic, and business sectors. She has served on many committees in the community through appointment of the Governor, Chief Justice, Mayor and Attorney General, including Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence, Hawaii State Commission on Status of Women, Access to Justice Commission and Hawaii Children's Trust Fund. In 2021, Nanci was selected by the Institute of Violence Abuse and Trauma to receive their Lifetime Achievement Award, and Hawaii Women Lawyers gave Nanci and DVAC the President's Award.

NICOLE MATTHEWS is Anishinabe from the White Earth Band of Ojibwe and is the Executive Director for the Minnesota Indian Women's Sexual Assault Coalition, where she has been employed since 2002. MIWSAC is a statewide Tribal Coalition and a national Tribal Technical Assistance Provider. Nicole was one of five researchers who interviewed 105 Native women used in prostitution and trafficking for their report: Garden of Truth: The Prostitution and Trafficking of Native Women in Minnesota. She is a TedX Speaker, and has spoken at statewide, tribal, and national venues on sexual violence, sex trafficking, and the intersections of racism and oppression.
