Presenter Biographies

ANDERSON, JANE brings her expertise in prosecuting domestic violence, stalking, sexual violence, and human trafficking to her role as an Attorney Advisor with AEquitas. Prior to joining AEquitas, Jane served as a prosecutor in Miami, Florida where she tried many of the state's first human trafficking cases. In her role as a founding member of the Human Trafficking Unit, Jane developed policies to better identify and provide necessary services to trafficking victims, while ensuring offender accountability through the use of digital evidence and creative charging decisions. Jane also served as a supervisor in the Domestic Violence Unit, where she trained new attorneys and oversaw the prosecution of domestic violence, stalking, and violations of protection orders. Throughout her career, Jane prosecuted felony-level crimes of all types, including homicide, kidnapping, and sexual assault. Jane graduated cum laude from American University, Washington College of Law and is based in the San Francisco Bay Area.

JUSUF, NINA has been working on domestic violence and sexual assault issues since 1992, starting as a hotline volunteer before becoming a shelter-based domestic violence advocate and later as the Executive Director of the San Francisco Women Against Rape for five years. She is one of the founders of National Organization of Asians and Pacific Islanders Ending Sexual Violence (NAPIESV) and has led numerous trainings and technical assistance on sexual assault and domestic violence issues and Asian Pacific Islander-specific trauma-informed services. Nina believes in collective wellness beyond self-care and has led/facilitated trainings on organizational sustainability; multicultural wellness, sustaining activists and activism; and genuine security for survivors, activists, and women human rights defenders in Asia, the Balkans, and United States. In addition, Nina has experience in leading an experiential learning-based youth organization and overseeing Home Based Childcare Center and Nutrition Program. She can be reached at nina@napiesv.org

LANDHUIS, JENNIFER (M.S.) is the Director of the Stalking Prevention, Awareness, and Resource Center (SPARC), an AEquitas initiative. As Director of SPARC, she oversees the multi-faceted programming on stalking, including the development of resources and publications as well as training and technical assistance. Jennifer has over 22 years of experience as an educator and advocate on the issues of stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault. Prior to joining SPARC, Jennifer was the Director of Social Change at the Idaho Coalition Against Sexual & Domestic Violence. In this capacity, she managed a variety of projects, including the Idaho Coordinated Response to Sexual & Domestic Violence and the Idaho Victims Assistance Academy. She also designed and facilitated state and national trainings on stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault to build the capacity of criminal justice systems. Earlier in her career, Jennifer spent eleven years as an advocate and educator for local domestic violence/sexual assault community-based crisis centers. She provided crisis intervention, including support, safety planning, information, shelter placement, and referrals for victims of stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault. She also provided 24-hour enhanced on-scene advocacy for hospitals and law enforcement agencies and implemented a screening program to assist health care professionals in recognizing and intervening with patients who have been victimized. Jennifer graduated from Midland University with a Bachelor of Arts in Youth and Family Ministry and the University of Cincinnati with a Master of Science degree in Criminal Justice. She is an adjunct professor at Boise State.

MATTHEWS, NICOLE is Anishinabe from the White Earth Band of Ojibwe and is the Executive Director for the Minnesota Indian Women's Sexual Assault Coalition (MIWSAC), where she has been employed since 2002. MIWSAC is a statewide Tribal Coalition and a national Tribal Technical Assistance Provider. Nicole was one of five researchers who interviewed 105 Native women used in prostitution and trafficking for their report: Garden of Truth: The Prostitution and Trafficking of Native Women in Minnesota. She is a TedX Speaker, and spoke at statewide, tribal, and national venues on sexual violence, sex trafficking, and the intersections of racism and oppression.

WYNECOOP-ABRAHAMSON, VICTORIA "TORI" (she/her) is a citizen of the Spokane Tribe located in Eastern Washington State and the Training and Technical Assistance Manager at the National Center on Domestic Violence, Trauma, and Mental Health (NCDVTMH). She began her advocacy journey during her undergraduate career at Illinois College by establishing a sexual assault support group in response to the #MeToo movement. After graduation, she returned home to the Spokane Indian Reservation and worked as a Domestic Violence Advocate providing assistance to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, teen dating violence, stalking, and elder abuse. Assistance for survivors often included accessing resources for civil and criminal court cases, mental health support, and substance use services. This position encouraged Tori to pursue and complete a Master of Social Work at the University of Chicago Crown Family School of Social Work, Policy, and Practice. Prior to joining NCDVTMH, Tori provided SAMHSA funded training and technical assistance to tribal communities and nations with a focus on building program capacity and sustainability in the areas of suicide prevention, substance use, and mental health.

YUSEF, MIRA is the Executive Director of Monsoon Asians & Pacific Islanders in Solidarity (Monsoon) and a co-founder and staff member of NAPIESV, a program under Monsoon that provides technical assistance and training nationally, in the U.S. territories, and at some international sites. She has helped incubate four other organizations serving victims of gender-based violence in marginalized populations: Nisaa African Family Services; Iowa Affirmation and Resources Chat chatline; Iowa Coalition for Collective Change; and Support for Arab Families in Iowa. Since 2010, Mira has been organizing and facilitating trainings and technical assistance on addressing gender-based violence locally, nationally, and internationally. She has a master's degree in Social Work, with specialization in Community Organizing, and a Master of Arts in Southeast Asian Studies from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. Mira was a recipient of a Fulbright Fellowship to pursue research in the Philippines on Muslim Filipinas employed as domestic workers in the Middle East. She was also awarded the National Security Education Program David Boren Fellowship to study the Indonesian and Malay languages, as well as conduct field research in Malaysia and Philippines.
